We want each team member to know that he or she is part of a large and growing movement whose goal is reaching people for Christ and walking with them to maturity by making disciples who make disciples.





One on One thrives among 8th graders in international school by Diane, teacher and disciple-maker, Rosslyn Academy, Kenya

TEACHING IN AN INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL is very interesting. On top of dealing with the usual teen issues, the teachers work in a unique situation where all the students are from different cultures, speak several languages, and don't really know where to call home! Because Rosslyn Academy is an international Christian school, about 40 percent of the student



body are students from missionary families. They have heard Bible stories all their lives, and in the 8th grade they are ready to get to know their God on a deeper level. The Discipleship Class was specifically developed for those students. With

six to eight students per class, One on One with God fits the need, and the students have thrived on it. From defining their personal salvation experiences to evaluating the quality of their



love, One on One has been instrumental in shaping these young disciples.

Last fall I taught two nine-week One on One courses. During the first nine weeks I had six 8thgrade boys who wholeheartedly jumped in to every discipline. They especially grew in their ability to

meditate and to seek and experience the presence of God. Just the thought of that class always brings me to tears.

During the second nine-week period, I had a class of six girls with a history of interpersonal relationship problems. They were not willing to open themselves up to much discussion, so I had them write papers to allow me to know their thoughts and communicate with them. Three in the class, like the boys, readily added the disciplines to their lives and became somewhat willing to share in the group.

To teach One on One, I have thrived on it. accomplishing almost everything that was slated for

each session. I also gave the students quiet time opportunities at the beginning of class for the first two weeks so they could get accustomed to it and ask any questions, all the while challenging them to consider what time of day they were going to incorporate a quiet time into their schedules at home and always suggesting the first thing in the morning. I also encouraged them to get journals and to begin using them to record their quiet times and lesson/sermon notes.

The fruit from One on One has been noticeable in our student body. One of the boys I discipled told me on the last day of class that he had always been afraid to close his eyes during worship because of what someone might think. But now he doesn't care and closes his eyes to worship! In chapel one day, a worship song began, and the whole auditorium remained seated. At one point I opened my eyes and saw him and another discipleship student standing in worship, alone, in the middle of the chapel. One by





one others also stood, until all were on their feet, worshiping. It was such a Holy Spirit time! To think of how he has grown in his faith in the last six months causes me to be overwhelmed at the "goodness of the Lord in the land of the living"!

One on One via MP3

FOR SOME TIME I needed a way to improve my daily devotion and morning Bible study time. I jumped from devotion book to devotion book, trying to find a meaningful plan for some growth in my life, but I was never satisfied. After discovering One on One with God, I know I have found a meaningful plan.

Since I was unable to meet regularly with someone to disciple me for the two-hour sessions, I found that the MP3 was

very helpful in guiding me toward a much deeper fellowship with Jesus and His plan for my life. It really helps to hear the interaction between the two men on the recordings. I look forward to each new session and the follow-up in the workbook.

After completing four sessions on the MP3, using the leader's guide and the workbook, I discovered that a friend at church had been through One On One with God about two years ago. Now we are meeting on Friday evenings to discuss what we've learned.

Dr. Shon Remich and his precious wife, Kim, are strong disciples who make disciples. Shon is a medical doctor and full colonel in the U.S. Army; he is also an ordained minister. Shon's assignment in Kenya has been to find a cure for AIDS, a 70-hour-per-week job. This is their story.

KIM AND I ARE COMPLETING our fifth consecutive year in Kenya; we were also here from 2003 to 2006, making a total of eight years. When we arrived in Kenya in 2008, tension remained from the recent Kenya elections. The country was starved for leadership. Many of our missionary brothers and sisters were dismayed because Kenyans with whom they worked

and worshiped were taking up arms against other Kenyans. There was a disconnect between what people professed and how they led their lives when the pressure was on. It was obvious to us that there was a desperate need for connecting on a per-

sonal level with Christ, which comes only through investing time with Him daily. There was and is a huge need for disciple-

Kenyans are a warm, hospitable people. When we arrived in 2008, we met up with Ezekiel ("EZ"), one of our One on One with God graduates from Kisumu. EZ introduced us to a young pastor, Alex (see p. 9), whom we were able to take through One on One with eleven other men. Pastor Alex has a vision for discipleship and was deeply blessed by One on One. Thanks to help and connections from Alex, EZ, and GFTF, we began to hold seven- to ten-day discipleship training programs in areas we knew were receptive to discipleship. We specifically focused on church leaders and lay people, and the training was received with great enthusiasm. We also continued the 15-session program with others in Pastor Alex's congregation and partnerships, which led to ministry opportunities in other areas—schools and orphanages, in particular. We later expanded our trainings to Rwanda and Uganda, again with brothers and sisters who were eager to learn.

During our third and fourth years, we began to run into specific challenges—challenges that were consistent with what

God's plan is for us to live out God's plan (Jeremiah 29:11 LIV). —Jerry

many missionary families were experiencing throughout their ministries. When we conducted week-long One on One trainings, the attendance to completion was from 70 percent to more than 80 percent. Following up on our groups, however, we found that although some discipleship was continuing to the second generation, it was patchy at best. When our discipleship classes did not involve serving a meal, tea, and snacks, attendance dwindled. Among our second- and third-generation disciples, an expectation of provision of food and drink had formed. Despite this, we continued moving forward with our 15-session courses, focusing on those who truly desired to grow into a deeper relationship with Christ.

While we know that this conflict has changed very little since the early church (I Corinthians 11:20), it has underscored our need to focus on what is really important.

In 2013 we plan to push into the university student arena. Last week we met with key university spiritual leaders and have planted a seed of discipleship in which we have a key leader going through the 15-session training. We are praying for other groups that are hungry for the Word of God. Having books incountry will form the foundation of our movement for 2013 and 2014, which is to try and monitor and support second-, third-, and fourth-generation disciple-makers. We are also praying that our brothers and sisters can sustain the One on One with God ministry in Kenya. We have had several meetings and discussions regarding how best to build sustainability within the One on One ministry, with several ideas discussed. In the end we know that God is in control. We have looked at various smallbusiness ventures that could support the ministry and possibly yield a small profit from the workbooks.

We have had the privilege of conducting three discipleship groups with the expatriate community and our work colleges. We are also excited to say that One on One has become part of the Rosslyn Academy curriculum, with discipleship classes being taught in the middle school. We have learned so many valuable lessons about God, His mercy and grace, and how He will take whatever we give Him and work with us to develop a platform on which He and only He can be worshiped and magni-

As we move forward, we believe that God holds great things for Kenya. We ask for prayers specifically for:

- 1. God's wisdom and obedience among those whom we disciple and for their follow-up with disciples.
- 2. God to develop the soil of our Kenya family so that the seeds of God will not be choked, burned, or eaten but rather will bring forth fruit a hundredfold.
- 3. God to work among our persecuted and the families of our martyred pastors in Eastleigh. Pray that they will not lose heart, that God will protect them, and that God's great revival will break through to this strong Muslim population.

Wonderful Counselor heals deafening pain

FIVE YEARS AGO my beautiful 16-year-old daughter, Lauren, was killed in a car accident. Because of the vibrant relationship with Jesus Christ she had before she went home, I know beyond doubt that she is alive with Him today in heaven. To tell of the impact One on One with God has had in her story and mine, I must go back seven years before the accident.

It was 2001, and at 37 years of age, I was a wife and mother

who thought I was living a Christian life and raising my children to do the same. In April of that year, however, the Holy Spirit opened my eyes to the beauty, grace, and personal nature of God's love for me. The joy

and freedom of this truth erased a lifetime of self-effort and self-condemnation. Suddenly I desired Jesus with all my heart and needed to know Him intimately. I hungered for God's Word and read it constantly. When a neighbor offered to disciple a group of us using One on One with God, I jumped at the chance. Not only did it give me the tools to grow my new relationship with Jesus and walk in daily surrender to Him, but it changed the way I raised my children.

Instead of merely training them in outwardly good behavior and character, I began to teach them how to know Jesus personally for themselves. The change in me was drastic as the Holy Spirit began to produce His fruit in me, and I believe God

used this and the principles from *One on* One I taught my children to change them as well.

After the accident, my world went black. Deafening pain drowned out God's voice inside me. Though I felt completely alone, I now know He never left me. He was the one who drew me back to His Word when I could do nothing else, and He used the habits I developed through One on One to do it. He spoke His prom-

ises into my heart over and over, and gradually I began to hear Him again. Over the next three years, the Holy Spirit counseled me through deep grief, fear, and confusion. As I pondered, pictured, and prayed my way through God's Word, He healed me with His promises. He restored our intimate fellowship and gave me purpose in this life again. In 2011, I published Wonderful Counselor: A Journey Through

Grief and Healing with the Holy Spirit. It is the story written in my

journals over three years of His intimate, personal counsel. He called me to share it with others so they could know God wants the same for them. He desires a love relationship and fellowship with all of His children and longs to walk us through the highs and lows of life on earth till we are home with Him.

Because I still live on this planet, God has shown me He still has things for me to do. He has let me disciple many women through One on One with God. I have seen young women learn to commune with Jesus in ways that have transformed

them and their families. Older women who were lifelong believers came to know Jesus as a personal God of love. One particularly special older friend has finally, after years of doubt, found assurance that she truly belongs to Jesus. Now she is fearless, heeding the Holy Spirit as He leads her to ask people every-

where she goes if they know Jesus.

The Lord has given our family the opportunity to become part of His Kingdom work in Ghana, West Africa. Building on Lauren's express desire to reach people around the world who don't know about the love of Jesus, we have built a church there. It sits not far from the coast in Winneba, Ghana, and is called Lauren's Lighthouse, a symbol of the light her life has become in this dark world. It is just one

answer to a prayer she wrote many times in her journals: "Let me be a light for You today, Jesus."

A church's primary disciple-making tool

AS I WRITE THIS AT 11 P.M., I have just finished investing a total of six hours today in discipling three other men. The greatest thrill is to know that I have invested that same amount of time saturating my own life with God's Word. God is good!

Our One on One with God story:

Two years ago God led me into full-time church ministry as a direct result of *One on One with God*. I was discipling some men from a nearby church because they wanted a disciple-



making tool for their congregation. I had spoken with their senior pastor about *One on One*, and he invited me to lead him and three other men through it. Around Session 8, the pastor asked if I would pray about applying for their newly established associate pastor position. Within months I was called to minister at the church and began to implement *One on One* as our primary disciple-making tool.

Since that time over 100 members of our church, ranging in age from 12 to 70, have completed *One on One*. Entire families are asking to be

discipled! Currently we have fourteen disciple-makers investing in the lives of thirty-four other church members. God has even led some of our members to go beyond our church to disciple believers in other churches. He is clearly at work, establishing

He is clearly at work, establishing a movement of ten generations of disciple-makers in our church.

a movement of *ten generations* of disciple-makers in our church. Right now one branch of our discipleship tree is in its fourth generation, and there are signs that other branches will duplicate those results. Our church members are excited to have a tool they can use to multiply them-

selves spiritually in the lives of others.

We are seeing wonderful things happen!

Three men, each of whom has been a deacon for more than twenty years, have been discipled and are discipling others. Eleven of our deacons overall have completed *One on One*. Eight of our Sunday school teachers and three associate teachers have been discipled and are now discipling others. A husband and wife who are youth group sponsors are working toward discipling every faithful, available, and teachable member of the youth group. A husband and wife, rocked by his adultery, are fighting for their marriage while being discipled. A woman has discipled her sister, who is now discipling their mother. Two self-proclaimed introverts are now making disciples in obedience to God's leading. One of our ladies has discipled eighteen, and one of our men has discipled fourteen. A man who had been deployed with the U.S. Navy for two years signed up for a *One on One* group immediately upon returning home because

of the testimony of his wife and brother who were discipled and are now discipling others. A spiritually mature retired pastor of thirty years and his spiritually mature wife are being led through *One on One*, encouraging even those who have been walking with God intimately for decades to join what God is doing in our church.

Discipleship celebration

This past fall we held our first annual COMPLETE: Celebration of Discipleship banquet. With over 100 in attendance, our pastor revealed our church's overall strategy to make disciples who make disciples. The vision that God laid on his heart for our church when he was called here over three years ago is from Colossians 1:28: "Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone complete in Christ." We are blessed to constantly hear from our pastor in the pulpit about the blessing and responsibility we have to "Go and make disciples."

Why we invest our lives in disciple-making

We desire to make disciples first and foremost because Jesus gave us the command to do so. We make disciples because we want our lives to reflect Him, to obey Him, and to please Him. We also desire that our lives should count for eternity, so we invest our lives in knowing God, saturating our lives with His Word, and sharing with others what He has taught us, training them to also share with others. God has allowed us to see Him moving in the hearts of men and women, encouraging us to continue in the mission to which He has called us.

Testimonies from our church members who have finished *One on One with God*:

"Over the last fifteen weeks, One on One has made a huge difference. Christ has really taught me to come out of my shell when praying in groups. One on One has taught me how to read the Word and challenged me to consistently be in it each day. It has also helped me see how important and useful it is to go back over sermon notes. A vision for making teenage disciples

IN THE YEAR 2000 I was just four weeks into being discipled through *One on One with* God when I was asked to take over a group whose leader was unable to continue. In fear and trepidation I accepted, and I have been mentoring and making disciples ever since. This initial opportunity led to an ongoing love of discipleship, for I saw the power of God's Word in the lives of Christians as they internalized principles that brought vitality and purposefulness to their lives.

Over the years God has altered my passion for making disciples and led me to focus on Christian young people. I have a vision for helping our youth mature and preparing them to reach their circles of influence in high school and as they enter college. *One on One* recommends that married men and women should be discipled in same-sex groups—for good reason. But high schoolers like to be with the opposite sex. In fact, I think it is healthy for them to see the opposite sex growing in Christ and hearing them internalize truths from scripture as they ponder, picture, and pray. Some might say that students will not share as openly in mixed groups as they will in a same-sex group. But I have seen that, in mixed groups of young people, time opens relationships and develops the willingness to be transparent and vulnerable, just as time opens relationships in a same-sex group.

I envision churches requiring One on One with God discipleship training of their youth before they graduate from high school. It would be even better, perhaps, to require evidence that they are becoming disciple-makers before they head for college. There is so much peer pressure to compromise in every area on college campuses, and statistics show that 80 percent of our youth drop out of church once they leave home. I see this as evidence that they have not been properly prepared to be on mission. They have not been mentored and taught how

to be effective in the Christian life and are, in a sense, power-less and ineffective. But with the right training, they can make a difference! One of my current students is beginning to make disciples after just five sessions of *One on One* training. She recognized that younger kids deal with tough challenges that can be understood better through the principles they learn in *One on One*.

Kids like to be busy, and *One* on *One* is a revolutionary tool when it comes to reaching young people who are not involved in sports or music or who seem to have no other avenue of activity besides the party scene. What if these borderline kids had

the opportunity to be mentored and infused with the vision of reaching their peers? What if One on One could be offered in high

schools, similar to a one-semester course in Bible, or as a detention activity? Other possible avenues for reaching youth with *One on One* might be through juvenile detention facilities or mental health facilities where children and high schoolers have attempted suicide. Their days are long, and therapy takes only a small part of each day.

After nine years as a home educator and fifteen years as a tutor, my life is seeing a new chapter written as my children desire the experience of going to public high school. As a CPA, my skill is in accounting, but my heart is in discipleship. Wouldn't this be a wonderful full-time job? Pray for me and my part in the work force again and in His Kingdom work. God is a vision giver and a vision fulfiller!

Discipling across hundreds of miles

I AM A FRESHMAN IN COLLEGE and have recently had an opportunity to take a couple of friends

It is easy to use, and we are currently in Session 8 of *One on One*.

Of course discipling over the phone requires some adjustments to be made! I cannot see the guys' follow-up sheets or initial them, so I simply ask them to read how much time they



wrote down for their quiet times each day. And it is imperative that I be very descriptive and specific, especially when telling them how to draw a diagram such as the right and wrong heart conditions or talking about a diagram such as the hand illustration.

But it's working! I know that each one in the group is learning much and applying those things he is learn-

ing. I am glad that I have taken the opportunity to disciple a few guys using *One on One with God* and am doing it over the phone.

Making disciples in an unnamed country

IN FEBRUARY 2011 our first team of One on One with God disciple-makers went to a country that cannot be named, for security reasons, in order to make disciples and produce disciplemakers. We followed up with another trip and another team of disciple-makers in October and November 2011. A third team of disciple-makers arrived in the country the last part of October 2012 and left on November 12, 2012.

On these three trips we discipled a few pastors and more than 100 of the 160 leaders of an organization that concentrates on reaching the youth of the country for Christ. On these three trips we discipled approximately 130 leaders and pastors. After each of our trips the leaders and pastors we discipled started making disciples.

When it was time for us to come back home after our third trip to this country, I told the leader of the organization that it was now their responsibility to reach their country by making disciples and producing disciple-makers. The organization leaders and pastors we discipled have responded by discipling an additional 1,570 people for a total of 1,700 people in this unnamed country over a peri-

od of twenty-three months (February 2011 through December 2012).

We continue to support the efforts of the disciple-makers in this country by paying for printing the One on One with God maWe praise God for these disciple-makers...who continue to make disciples at great risk to themselves.

Transformed: A new heart and an exciting new life

ON MAY 6, 2008, I began meeting weekly at Glenn's house with a group of men who were going through One on One with God. I had recently been promoted at work and was feeling the burden of added responsibilities; my home life had stepped up a notch as well, with the birth of my second son a few months earlier. Free time was not easy to come by, and one of the first things to go had been my time in the Word. After all, I was 29 years old with a great wife, two healthy children, a house, two

cars, and a great title at work, and I had done it all on my own—or so I thought. Jeremiah 17:5 NIV84 perfectly described me then: "Cursed is the one who trusts in man, who depends on flesh for his

strength and whose heart turns away from the Lord." I trusted in my own abilities and decisions, looked at life from a worldly perspective, and thought it was good or at least better than most.

The first several weeks of the study I crammed the night before we met and caught up on all I hadn't done throughout the week. But then something switched inside me, and I began to desire time that I could invest with God. I think it was a combination of scripture memory and meditation that fostered the change. Memorization came easily to me, as it has all my life. In fact, I still remember all the Bible stories I heard as a child. Because I always knew the right church answers, I felt as though I was better than others or more spiritual than they were. But no one had ever asked me to meditate on a verse and tell what it meant to me or where I saw myself in it. I remember the first

verse, Luke 9:23, that made it from my head to my heart. All I could do was repeat the words deny Himself over and over. The scales fell from my eyes and my heart as I began to crave scripture as never before. The Bible came to life as I pictured myself

When our time with Glenn ended, he encouraged us to start a group ourselves. This put me at a crossroads with one of my scripture memory cards, 2 Timothy 2:2 NIV84: "And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable men who will also be qualified to teach others." I knew what I should do, but my flesh kept telling me that I wasn't qualified. Soon after I started my first group, I was asked to go and teach the men of Zambia with my church for a week. Each year since I have been able to both lead a group in my home and go to Zambia to teach. Now I cannot imagine a life where I am not investing in the lives of others around me. God used a tool (One on One with God) and a disciple (Glenn) to transform me. He changed my desires and replaced them with His desires. He took away my will and replaced it with His will. He also took my trust in myself and placed that trust in Him. Jeremiah 17:7-8 NIV84 says, "But blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in Him. He will be like a tree planted by water..."

I say all of this not to boast of what I am involved in or what I have done but as a testimony to others. I am an unschooled, ordinary man who wants nothing more than to be used by God to help others see what they have been missing. Acts 4:13 NIV84 says, "When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and took note that these men had been with Jesus."

build their confidence in the Word so that, before they know it, they are reading and memorizing large portions of Scripture. *One* on One was perfectly paced, with just the right baby steps in the Word leading to running a biblical marathon with confidence. Through *One on One*, any person, regardless of reading comprehension ability, will experience confidence and success in getting into the Word.

I absolutely love how all time in the Word is approached with the meditation and journaling method. I started the class as one who primarily used my strategic time in God's Word to glean truth. I was missing a simple, repeatable approach to quiet times. One on One's approach of ponder-picture-pray helps protect us from making random personal interpretations of the text and consistently drives us to apply the truths we are confronted with. The structure of the reading plan is also one of the best I have seen. I love how the daily readings consist of two different Old Testament texts, a chapter of Proverbs, and a New Testament text. The plan is really well thought-out and has me excited to follow it.

Christian is not even the goal. It is clear


from start to finish that Christ is the goal,

and I love that. I started One on One as a person who got into God's Word daily, most often to study it. Over time the Bible had become a bit of a textbook, required reading for the course of Christian life. The fifteen weeks of One on One has gently and firmly refocused my time in the Word. Rather than being work, it is a well, a chance to meet Christ and lay myself at His feet.

One on One sees growth in East Africa

IT HAS BEEN MY PLEASURE to work for One on One with God and a great honor to serve alongside Dr. Shon and Ezekiel (see p.



4). Our goals have been these: to engage universities/colleges and students, to engage high schools, to work closely with Noah from Uganda and John from Rwanda, to continue with the 15-session One on One with God training in local churches, and to continue with one-week crusades.

We have received a lot of testimonies from our One on One with God disciples. We held a oneweek crusade in Kisii in Kenya's Nyanza Province, and many pastors said there has since been a lot of spiritual and numerical growth in their churches. In Kakamega in the Western Province of Kenya, a

woman wrote to say that bitterness between her and another woman was healed because of what they had learned in One on One. We had a training in Embu in the Eastern Province of

Kenya. Several churches there had previously adopted a policy regarding forgiveness that had offended many members and caused them to leave the church;

after going through One on One, the churches realized they were wrong in that policy. Other pastors in Embu have told me that although they had not been working together for over 15 years, One



Sergey says that up to this point 99 percent of the discipleship groups in Ukraine involve just two people. In the past there were more than seventy pairs going through One on One, but many of them took One on One as bread for themselves and have not yet become disciple-makers. Sergey also reports that they now have twenty to twenty-five One on One disciplemakers scattered throughout Ukraine, and they presently have about fifty people being discipled through One on One.

The Ukrainians have printed 300 copies of One on One in Kiev and plan to print another 300 copies sometime between June and August 2013. We were not aware of the first printing, but we plan to help them with the cost of the second printing.

A faith story from Ukraine: God provides!

When Ukrainian disciples decided to print One on One with God in their country, no funds were available for the project. So Sergey began a search to find out how much it would cost to print the One on One materials needed. He found that the best and least expensive printing facility was located near Kiev. This printer gave a price quote of 7500 Ukrainian hryvnas (\$940 US) to do the job.


With this amount in mind, Sergey and his disciples raised about one-sixth of what they needed among themselves. Next he asked all his friends for contributions, which brought the total collected to 3500 Ukrainian hryvnas. Still 4000 hryvnas were needed. At this point God provided in a miraculous way. Sergey said, "As you know, God never leaves us alone in His Great Commission, so he sent us a person who paid the balance of what we needed."

One on One testimonies from **Ukraine:**

- "Y," whom Sergey is discipling now, is changing from a guy who loved the world to a guy who loves Jesus more and more. He started a daily reading of God's Word with notes, and it is purifying his language from bad words. This is only the beginning for Y.
- Zoya is understanding more about true discipleship and has started discipling one girl from her small
- Yeugen, whom Sergey discipled first, is discipling Andrew, and there is a lot of potential in him. Before discipling Andrew, Yeugen discipled Vova, who became a really good disciple-maker.
- Igor, discipled by Sergey, has started One on One with God with his wife, Sveta, and her friend.
- Pastor Nikolay, whom Sergey discipled, has started One on One with God at 6:00 a.m. every Wednesday with Alex, who came from a rehabilitation center.

Making disciples in the Northwest

IN THE SUMMER OF 2009, my wife and I started making disciples in our new church in the northwestern part of the U.S. From an active church membership of about 500 members, my



wife and I lead two separate groups through *One on One with God*. One of the men who took the course was the church's adult ministry pastor. The other was a layman and former elder in the church. While none of these individuals have used One on One to make disciples, clearly a seed was planted to grow other groups.

Since that summer in 2009, my wife and I have led eighteen women and fourteen men through *One on* One. Of the men and women who have gone through One on One, approximately eight men and women

seem to have a heart for discipleship, but we pray that our number will increase as we continue to show others what we know about making disciples through knowing Jesus Christ more intimately.

On three occasions the church has printed in our monthly church magazine some powerful testimonies of how God has transformed members' lives while going through One on One.

In at least one publication they credited One on One with the testimonies of those mentioned. While One on One is not formally endorsed, the adult and young adult pastors continue to use it as one of their tools to show how men and women

can develop a lifestyle pattern of meditating on God's Word and being in prayer throughout the day. Without a doubt those who have grasped the precepts of One on One have life-changing testimo-

We now have about sixty people who have completed *One* on One with God, and some of them have joined us in making disciples who make disciples. At the present time we have the following *One on One* groups meeting:

- two women's classes with two women in each class
- one men's class with six men (co-led by two men)
- one men's class with three men
- one men's class with two men

program called the Prison Entrepreneurship Program (PEP), which takes motivated men and gives them an accelerated mini-business These men are introduced

to Christian principles, and most graduate from PEP hungry for more of Christ.

I challenged these men to begin giving their faith away relatively quickly. During Session 1 of One on One with God, I had them add commitment #6 to page 11: "I will begin discipling another person within the next eight weeks." As I had promised, I went with each of them as they began with their first **disciple.** The result was that today, only eight months later, two of those men have third-generation disciples, and one has a fourth-generation disciple. These men have remarked that they

are amazed at how much more God taught them as they led

Today we have a mini-movement bubbling at the Cleveland unit, with eighteen men involved in personal discipleship. We are praying that God will turn this small thing into a huge thing as He transforms lives. Please pray that these men will not only become reformed but transformed as they help others know Christ deeply, intimately, and personally.

A disciple-making movement in Zambia

A MOVEMENT IS IGNITING ZAMBIA. In 2009 a group of men from First Baptist Church, Colleyville, TX, went to Zambia with the intention of making disciples using *One on One with God*. Little did this group know that their efforts would expand into a great movement of God and transform a nation.

The goal of the initial project was to lead a group of men through *One on One* with the hope that they would develop a

personal walk with Jesus and gain an understanding of the need to disciple others. The group's efforts were successful as they invested their time in twelve Zambian men. These men later became the core group of leaders who took *One on One* and their new passion for Jesus and disciple-making to their countrymen.

In the years to follow, the partnership with these twelve men grew in ways only the Lord can explain. There have been over 3,000 men and

women discipled, with over 1,200 who have reproduced themselves, and the multiplication process continues. While in Zambia on one occasion, one of the U.S. leaders decided to illustrate the principle of multiplication by using the people in the room who were known to have been products of the movement. He started with Jerry Fine, who had discipled him; then he pointed

Prayers God Answers

In Africa I heard Pastor Simon preach a great message on prayer. His title was "Prayers God Answers," based on Mark 10:36-52 and the prayer of the blind man, Bartimaeus. Pastor Simon noticed that Bartimaeus's prayer was **desperate**, **persistent**, and **specific**. I noticed that in context his prayer was also **filled with faith**.

I have noticed the same four characteristics in other passages: in Hannah's prayer for a son (1 Samuel 1:10-18), in Jairus's prayer for his dying daughter (Mark 5:22-23), and Jesus' prayer in the garden before His crucifixion (Mark 14:33-42). But I noticed in Jesus' prayer that He added one more thing, which was the most important of all: "Yet not what I will, but what You will." Jesus wanted the Father's will more than He wanted His own will.

Therefore, we have evidence that God has answered prayers that are desperate, that are persistent, that are specific, that are filled with faith, and that seek God's will.

to a U.S. team member whom he had discipled and then pointed out a Zambian whom that team member had discipled. From there he pointed out multiple others who had been discipled. When the illustration was complete, at least eight generations were represented in the room. Everyone was amazed, including the U.S. leadership. God had been at work, and we could see the fruit in front of us. Since that time many others from the U.S. have gone to Zambia to participate in this movement, discipling many Zambians and training them to disciple others.

The work of disciple-making and the movement are now being given over to the Zambian leadership, with efforts being mounted to allow the movement to be sustainable and fully operated by the Zambian leadership. As discussions occurred and plans were made for this transition, a need arose for *One on One* to be translated into the heart language of the Zambian people. This effort was taken on, with two languages—Bemba and Nyanja—identified as having the largest potential for the most far-reaching effect on the people of Zambia to be and build disciples. The translation process was slow and arduous, with many bumps in the road. Setbacks occurred due to a lack of communication and physical presence in the country.

However, in 2012 the Lord raised up a U.S. leader who could go to Zambia for three months to take on this very important task. This leader, who had been to Zambia on many occasions and had been actively involved in making disciples both in the U.S. and in Zambia, had a burden for making disciples and the people of Zambia and wanted to give himself to help fan the flame that was burning in the country. In October 2012 this leader took a 90-day, unpaid leave of absence to go to Zambia. While there he helped complete the first translation of *One on One* into Bemba and began and nearly completed the work on the Nyanja translation. By early December the first print run was complete, and *One on One* was made available to disciplemakers to lead groups.

The Lord has blessed the work in Zambia with many being discipled, but the work has not been limited to Zambia. In 2012 a people group in Botswana, Namibia, Congo, and Tanzania heard about *One on One and* contacted the national leaders in Zambia about the program and the movement going on there. They were excited to hear what the Lord had been doing and wanted the work to be done in their countries as well. That very year representatives were sent from Zambia to present *One on One* and the disciple-making strategy and to share the details of what God had done in Zambia. On some occasions representatives from ministries and groups traveled into Zambia to learn more about what they had been hearing. All these meetings and conversations have proven themselves to be opportunities to ignite movements in other places in Sub-Saharan Africa.

In these days efforts are continually being made to strengthen the movement and prepare for the growth God has in store for our Zambian brothers and sisters. These efforts include continued training for disciple-makers, including leaders in local churches.

One on One travels from Asia to Poland

After the service the church had lunch in the basement of the church building. Isaac and I were sitting with Konstanty Wiazowski, who is former president of the Warsaw Seminary, my former theology professor, and a retired pastor. During the Iron Curtain days, Konstanty translated hundreds of Christian books from English into Polish,

and he still does much translation work. During lunch I shared about *One on One*, and Isaac explained it further. Konstanty's wife immediately said, "If you have books, give them to Kon-

stanty. He has too much free time now!" I had the books with me and did as she suggested. One month later Konstanty called me and said, "The workbook is done. I am starting on



the leader's guide." Both books are now completely translated into Polish.

Since then I have been in the process of testing the translation by discipling three brothers in Christ: Krzysztof, Daniel, and Paul. We plan to finish before the end of May and look forward to having Jerry and Marilyn and two other couples visit us to make disciples in the fall.

ISAAC is a Malaysia-based pastor who retired in 2002 and founded Friends of Pastors International (FOPI), an organization dedicated to helping pastors and church leaders in remote and poor places in the Asian Pacific region.

Through FOPI Brother Isaac (1) meets pastors, either individually or in small and large groups for teaching purposes; (2) gives out one-time gifts

gives out one-time gifts or seed-money for sustainable and renewable projects to help needy pastors financially; and (3) gives books to pastors in their language and at their reading level.

A good friend of Go Face to Face International, Inc., Brother Isaac has been involved in printing copies of the *One on One with God* workbook and leader's guide to donate to pastors, churches, and teaching centers wherever he goes.

God is planting a disciple-making church

PLANTING A NEW CHURCH requires careful planning and the execution of a biblically sound strategy. In 2012 six families were sent out from Riverside Community Church in the Philadelphia suburbs to begin a new church, Ridgeline Community Church, in a different Philadelphia suburb.

There are several popular strategies for starting a church, such as getting a great band and starting with an attractional worship service or growing a home Bible study and pushing it to expand to other homes before launching a service. I was discipled through *One on One with God* thirteen years before launching this church plant, so I was committed to making disciples who make disciples. I knew that a worship service would not produce disciples. I firmly believed that where you have disciples making disciples, you have a church that grows a worship service.

So with a disciple-making blueprint as our plan for planting a church, we ordered a case of *One on One* books. Our plan was to disciple our core team and then release them to make disciples. Within the first four months, we walked our core team

through the disciple-making process. They were challenged throughout to pray for and prepare to lead someone through *One on One* once we finished.

As our group of six families expanded to twelve families, we made sure that new people were placed with new graduates. After eleven months we launched a public worship service with eighteen families (around seventy-five people).

We ordered our second case of *One on One* books a few months ago. Two weeks ago I had the joy of handing a leader's guide to a man I had discipled last year to give a man he is finishing discipling now so that he could begin discipling his own group! That's four generations within a year and three months, right before my eyes! The disciple-making model is straight from Jesus' playbook, and it is designed for multiplication.

A Malaysian disciple's testimony

THANK YOU FOR INVITING ME TO SHARE about my experiences going through and eventually leading others through *One on One with God*.

Before *One on One*, I was struggling in my faithfulness to God. By that I mean that I was not consistent with my quiet time, and sometimes my prayers to Him were few and far between.

sponses to God throughout the day, be it at home, at work, or commuting to work.

One on One is truly a wonderful tool for equipping and discipling. I would recommend it to everyone desiring a closer spiritual walk with God. And I would especially recommend that they take up the challenge to disciple others by leading them through One on One. Jesus in His wisdom commanded us, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations...teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you..." (Matthew 28:19-20 NIV). Now I understand why.





New publications to meet people's needs

THROUGH WORKING WITH GFTF, I've had several "pen pals," brothers and sisters in Christ who have translated or helped with the translations of the One on One with God workbook and leader's guide into languages other than English. It has been a blessing to converse with John in Rwanda, Liliana in Romania, Natalie in Oklahoma and North Carolina, Elisabet in Spain, Dan in Washington, "E" in an unnamed country, and Chunhai, Karen, Marcos, and Andrea in Oklahoma City.

My most recent pen pal, "X," lives in a hard place that is not friendly to Christians, but he took on the task of making translations of our books specifically targeted toward his country. We

became friends as we corresponded back and forth during the process of turning his text into high-quality desktop publishing files.

X works with a ministry that uses One with God to disciple high school students before they graduate and leave for their years of mandatory military service. The timing of this ministry's work is crucial because their goal is to develop strong disciples who are prepared to withstand the harsh conditions and atheistic indoctrination they will face in the military. In X's na-

tion high school is rigorous and time-consuming, and it wasn't long until the ministry recognized that completing One on One in the twelve sessions their workbook required was very hard

for students who were weighed down with schoolwork. Would it be possible, they wondered, to spread the twelve sessions out over twenty-four or more sessions?

At Jerry and Marilyn's direction, I divided up the material to create sessions that would require about an hour of meeting time and less homework. Using the English version of X's workbook as a reference and cutting and pasting the corresponding blocks of text from the workbook in X's language, Go Face to Face soon had a new 26-session workbook, ready for X to proofread and adjust. During this time X taught himself to use the specialized desktop publishing software I use, which allowed him to make corrections and changes without my help. After a few months, X sent us his final revision, I put in the finishing touches, and the interior of the workbook was complete.

But that's not the end of the story! X and several others from his ministry were recently in America, and I got to meet my friend, discuss the new workbook, and hear about life and ministry in his country. Our next project together has been to create a leader's guide for the new workbook. Because the end product was to be in English for X to translate into his language, it only took a few days to make a 26-session leader's guide. X is currently working on this book, in between family, ministry, and education-related duties.

Pray for X and those who serve with him in ministry. Pray for the new 26-session books as they are part of an amazing movement of God in a hard place. Pray that the students and leaders will change their nation as they faithfully make disciples who make disciples.

the legal fraternity, and several professors from a high-ranking university. Over thirty of us met in the home of one of the high court iudges in this country that cannot

be named for security reasons. These people love the Lord and are excited to be salt and light for Him where they are. They are looking forward to using One on One with God soon.

After the meeting, one of the high court judges led me to the hospital to meet her father, a local leader who had been unconscious the day before. But on this morning he had recovered. He told his daughter, the judge, that he wanted to be baptized. I had the privilege of carefully explaining the plan of salvation to this man, and a professor baptized him. God is working in an unusual way in this country!

WHEN I WAS LEADING SESSION 11 of One on One with God and was explaining Acts 1:8, "you shall be my witnesses...," I

shared the lawyer's definition of shall meaning "without discretion." I also remembered my flying days and how the words shall, should, may, and will were specifically defined for us so that we had no confusion.

The book all aviators use is called *NATOPS*. One is made for each aircraft. We called it the "big blue bible" because our lives depended on it. The book contained every emergency procedure we had to memorize and every in-



tricate detail of the engine and accessories that could kill us if they failed and did not work right. I remember how I spent hundreds of hours memorizing and learning in detail every system in my plane—but would not spend five minutes in the real Bible that has eternal consequence for me and others.
